

Mr. Joseph Garcia is Chief Financial Officer for a federal government agency in Washington, DC. Previously, he was the CFO for FEMA Gulf Coast Hurricane Katrina Recovery operations in their New Orleans, Louisiana office, where he served in this Senior Executive Service position for three years. He established a Good Stewardship Council and his mantra was "to not sacrifice the recovery mission, but to honor the sacrifices of the American taxpayers who provided us with their resources." His efforts dramatically improved resource management across the Gulf Coast.
